## Getting a Diagnosis

- Try to see the same doctor every time you visit and express your concerns about development
- Ask for a referral to a child psychologist for diagnostic testing
- "wait and see" is not a good option
- TRICARE allows three opinions

## Once You Have a Diagnosis

- 1. Enroll in the Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)
- 2. Enroll in Extended Care Health Option (ECHO)
- 3. Get on your state's waiting lists and check your child's eligibility for SSDI

#### **Exceptional Family Member Program**


#### Created to

- assist the service member in identifying available services at their next assignment
- confirm the availability of medical and educational support at oversees locations
- identify the need for assignment within major medical areas

# Extended Health Care Option ECHO

- Additional program to TRICARE
- Pays for durable equipment, ABA and respite
- \$36,000 per year limit New Health Care Reform Law does not apply to TRICARE
- 2 programs
  - regular ECHO covers BCBA only
  - "Demo" covers non-BCBAs only for ASD dx only
- Monthly cost share (starting at \$25)

## ASD diagnosed vs ECHO services



Yellow bar – number of active duty dependents with ASD diagnosis

Blue bar – number enrolled in ECHO program

#### Medicaid and SSI

- Every state is different. Check what is available in your state and how to get on the waitlist.
- It's important to get on the list so the state sees the need to fund more spots.
- Rank E-6 and below should apply for Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

#### TRICARE Prime

- The "HMO" option
- No co-pays at Military Treatment Facility (MTF)
- Referrals and authorizations required
- Your PCM should refer you to a DAN! doctor

\*2012 TRICARE ABA policy and MOAA reimbursement policies changed

#### **TRICARE Standard & Extra**

- Extra uses TRICARE Network providers
  - File claims for you
  - You pay 15% of approved rate
- Standard uses non-Network providers
  - File your own claims
  - You pay 20% of approved rate
- Referrals not required (DAN!)
- Some care may require prior authorizations (OT, speech)

## TRICARE Supplements



- 6-month waiting period for pre-existing conditions
- Pays your co-pays (for doctors, therapy, prescriptions, ECHO)
- Pays the difference between what your DAN! charges and what TRICARE allows for a doctor's office visit. (As long as TRICARE approves 1¢ supplement will pay the rest).

#### **DAN! Visit -- Costs Compared**

For example: You are charged \$500 for a DAN! visit. \$166 is approved by TRICARE for a new patient visit. This is what you will receive back if your deductible is already met.

Plan	Referral	Math	Reimbursement
Prime with POS option	no referral	50% of \$166=	\$83
Prime	referral	100% of \$500=	\$500*
Standard	no referral	80% of \$166=	\$133
Standard with Supplement	no referral	80% of \$166 & supplement pays 20% of \$166 & \$500 - \$166 =	\$500

<sup>\*</sup>Rate depends on the doctor's agreement with TRICARE—whether they are network, non-network or do not accept assignment (do not accept insurance). Do not expect to be fully reimbursed with this option.

## Prescriptions

- Options for filling prescriptions
  - 1. MTF Pharmacy FREE
  - TRICARE Retail Network Pharmacy (like Walgreens)– generics are \$3, brands \$9 or \$22
  - 3. TRICARE mail order 3 month supply for \$3, \$9 or \$22
  - 4. Non-Network Pharmacy (ie Compounding Pharmacy)



- Prepay at the lower cost then submit
- Make sure all the codes are filled in
- If you need codes, check out the list on the TACA website

#### Claims

- DD Form 2642 is available online and is easy to fill out
- Keep a copy for yourself including the date you mailed it, when & how much you were reimbursed

- Excellent way to track your Explanation of Benefits (EOB)
- Option to turn off paper statements
- Ask a question about an EOB through the mailbox section of website

#### ExpressScripts.com

Track claims online and ask questions about claims



- An appropriate amount of ABA hours
- Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT)
- Extended warranties on durable medical equipment



- TRICARE thinks the school should pay
- The school thinks TRICARE should pay
- The child gets no services
- Be prepared to argue your case

#### **Financial Assistance**

- TACA's all things financial
- Look for Scott's National List on American Military Family Autism Support
- Integrative Hyperbaric Centers
- Ask other military parents how they got coverage
- ACT! Today for Military Families

#### **Medical Records**

- Military OneSource DoD Special Needs Toolkit & Special Care Organizational Record 1-800-342-9647
- Have your own copy of all records
- Never give away your only copy!

#### **Immunizations**

- Required for service members unless they have a medical or administrative exemption
- Not required for family members unless they attend a DoD school or day care center
- Overseas requirements, you may be required by the country to receive a vaccine. Sometimes new command has the final say.
- Have medical exemptions signed for new school before you move

## Military Housing

- Check out the schools for each housing area
- Ask if EFMP families get placed higher in the waiting list
- Privatized housing is not in the chain of command - they don't have to help you
- Check your Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) and see what you can afford to rent or buy off base

## Legal

- Judge Advocate General (JAG) attorneys located on base can prepare your wills and last testaments and durable power of attorney
- Special Needs Trusts can sometimes be done by contracted attorneys who work on base – ask before you spend the money off-base
- Rules governing Special Needs Trusts are different state-to-state. Ask if there is someone who can review it when you move.

## **PCSing**

- Research! Research! Research a new community before you move.
  - Yahoo groups, military groups, EFMP coordinator
- Make sure your current IEP is very detailed about services received
- Ask teacher to write transition notes
- Ask about and get on waiting lists for SLPs, OTs, and ABA providers
