What is Autism?

- Autism is a devastating neurological and biological disorder that typically affects children between the ages of 18 months to five years of age.
- 1 in every 91 children in the U.S. is diagnosed with Autism
- It is estimated that there are almost 2 million people in the United States alone living with an autism spectrum disorder.
- Autism rates are rising world wide.







The Autism Spectrum

Autism is a spectrum disorder affecting each individual uniquely

Some are severely affected, cannot speak, require constant one-on-one care, and will never be able to live alone. Others have less severe symptoms, can communicate, and will eventually acquire the necessary skills to live independently.

- 5) Medical issues





- Support and visibility for professionals delivering services to the TACA Community










